Business Tips / Advice



To Do Around Dadeville, AL


Pick of the month...

Hike Cherokee Ridge on The Deadening Alpine Trail. This is one of the Dadeville area's hidden gems.

Your hike will take you on a marked trail through the forest, across streams, over a hilltop, down into valleys and along the Lake Martin shoreline.

There are 2 trails (3.1 miles and 4.2 miles) and a map posted for your view. It would be a good idea to take a picture of the map with your phone to use for reference along the way. The trails take you along the Lake Martin shoreline where you can observe both Chimney Rock & Acapulco Rock and down towards Goat Island. One trail takes you to a viewing place atop a large rock jetting out above the water, the other trail takes you down closer to the waters edge with the same views.

These trails are a bit of a challenge at times and not for anyone who is physically challenged. Since these are nature trails, there may be branches/trees across the trail. The trail is sometimes narrow or steep or both. Take it slow and bring plenty of water. Please be respectful of the forest and take out anything that you bring in. Below is a map to the start of the trail. Overlook Drive is off of Hwy. 50. This trail entrance and parking is located inside the Harbor entrance. Happy trails...

Dadeville Interesting History

Dadeville was named for Major Francis Langhorne Dade, who died in the Seminole War in 1835. The town was granted a charter in 1837 and was first incorporated in 1858, lost its charter during the Civil War, and was incorporated a second time in 1878. Dadeville has been the Tallapoosa County seat since 1838.

Folklore?

The Harper Hill Church and Cemetery on Prospect Road, Dadeville, AL (located just west of Turkey Trail), have been abandoned and in disrepair for many years, but some visitors say that its former residents still linger there. Local Legends state that well over a century ago the minister who lived in the church went utterly mad and murdered his entire family, then killed himself. Ever since then there have been reports of strange apparitions in the small church's windows, or even the sound of the old minister preaching to his congregation. They say that you can still experience them today whether it's the sound of someone walking through the leaves around you, a woman or children heard screaming or the apparition in the window. - Anonymous
